The City of Blackfoot, located in southeastern Idaho, is only 25 minutes from Idaho State University and within an easy drive of Yellowstone National Park. Blackfoot is the county seat of Bingham County, home of the Eastern Idaho State Fair and is also known for being an area rich in agriculture. Working for the City in this capacity benefits our thriving community by ensuring that our citizens and businesses have environmentally safe treated wastewater.

POSITION SUMMARY: Working under the direct supervision of the Collection System Supervisor and general supervision of the WWTP Superintendent, the primary function of an employee in this position is to perform semi-skilled and skilled installation, maintenance, inspection, and repair work on a wastewater and storm sewer collection system as well as other duties in the Public Works Department if required. The principal duties of this position are performed in an outdoor environment that may include working in adverse weather conditions and hazards involving the use of power tools, equipment and exposure to hazardous materials while maintaining compliance with Federal, State, County, City and other applicable public health environmental and safety standards.

Possession of Idaho Class I Wastewater Collections Operator -In-Training certificate (minimum) is required within six (6) months from the date of hire. An Idaho driver's license with Class B CDL and tanker endorsements are also required within 90 days of date of hire.

Starting salary ranges from \$13.20 to \$14.20/hour depending upon qualifications, plus benefits.

REQUIREMENTS:

- High school diploma or GED equivalency and one (1) year wastewater collection and/or treatment or related system experience required OR any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary to perform the work;
- Accurately follow written and oral instructions;
- Accurately read and interpret system maps, diagrams and technical and operational manuals;
- Accurately read and interpret meters, operational and testing equipment;
- Operate power equipment and hand tools;
- Operate specialized system inspection, cleaning, and maintenance equipment;
- Prepare written reports and maintain system performance records;
- Communicate clearly and effectively with the public and other employees;
- Sufficient personal mobility, flexibility, stamina, vision and balance to work in an office and wastewater treatment environment.
